# HOMECOMING OF THE CLASS OF THE 1980

He is a result-oriented banking professional with 32 years' experience. He had headed the then largest regional rural bank in the country viz; Kerala Gramin Bank, as its Chairman. He currently serves as the General Manager and Secretary to the Board of Canara Bank. He spoke mainly about the lessons he learnt at Loyola, and how they helped his career.

His talk was a career guidance session on banking and management as well. Our final speaker was Mr Atul Dinkar Rane. After his schooling at Loyola, he graduated in Electronics and Communication Engineering from Guindy Engineering College, Chennai, and received his postgraduate degree in Guided Missiles from the University of Poona. He currently serves as the Director General, BrahMos, DRDO and CEO & MD BrahMos Aerospace Pvt. Ltd. His



talk with the students touched on his life after school, his work at DRDO, and different stages of India's development in missiles and defence.

The interactive session of the students with the batch was the most exciting part of the reunion. The brilliant way they answered the extraordinary questions from the inquisitive students was most admirable.
