Deepawali is one of the most significant Hindu festivals celebrated across India. When a person removes the darkness of his ignorance and ignites the light of knowledge on him, he experiences unlimited supernatural bliss. Deepawali is exactly that bliss.

Lankapati Ravan was an Asur who kidnapped Sita Mata. The day Shri Ram reclaimed Sita Mata by killing the abductor is celebrated as Vijayadashmi which comes 21 days before Deepawali. Capacity Suilding Programme on EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The Central Board of Secondary Education emphasizes the empowerment of teachers and principals of its affiliated schools through its Capacity Building Programme on Experiential Learning (CBPEL). In order to facilitate the CBPEL, a workshop was organized at Loyola School Trivandrum on October 21 and 22, 2022. It was attended by 58 teachers from all CBSE schools in and around the city. Fr Roy Alex, SJ and Mrs Soni B. George, Principal and Vice Principal of Loyola CBSE, respectively, were in-charge of the programme. The resource persons were Mrs M. R. Rakhy Prince and Mrs Sree Rekha Prasad.



Mrs M. R. Rakhy Prince is the Principal of Sree Narayana Vidyapeetam Public School, Tripunithura. She has a teaching experience of 25 years and administrative experience of 21 years. A postgraduate in Botany & Aquaculture, Mrs Prince is also a trainer certified by CBSE Centre of Excellence and a JCI certified national trainer.

Mrs Sree Rekha Prasad, the Principal of Siddhartha Central School, Pallimon, Kollam, is the recipient of *Principal of the Year Award 2022* instituted by Universal Mentors Association, Delhi, and the *Award of Excellence* instituted by

Lifology, a Guinness World Record-winning organization for exemplary contribution to education and positive intervention to keep learning seamless during the pandemic. She is a member of CBSE in the module preparation related to NEP 2020 named *Initiative to School Education* and is also a CBSE resource person in experiential learning, 21st century skills, career guidance, value education, NEP 2020, gamification in learning, school as anger-free zone, vocational education, and art integration. She has conducted webinars on competency and skill-based education, early childhood and education, and been a panellist for 24 News channel, ScooNews, EDUtalk and various other platforms.









Experiential Learning is a nontraditional process through which students develop knowledge, skills and values from direct experiences outside a traditional academic setting. It is a well-known model in education, training, facilitation and organizational development. The basic model of experiential learning cycle is: *Do Reflect Decide*.

The two-day workshop began with a hymn rendered by the Loyola teachers' choir. Fr Roy Alex, SJ welcomed the gathering. Fr P.T. Joseph, SJ, Principal Loyola ICSE and Director Loyola CBSE felicitated the gathering. Teachers were oriented on the Kolb's cycle, three learning domains in Bloom's taxonomy, the SMART check on learning outcome, the LAAR strategy and multiple intelligences. Various group activities were organized amongst the participants in order to incorporate the above aspects in the sample lesson plan. Certificates were distributed to the teachers at the end of the 2nd day. It was indeed a very educative and useful session for the CBSE teachers.
