#### Celebrating Ignatian Values and Achievements at Loyola School





#### LOYOLA MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Loyola MUN took place on July 15, 2024, with the General Assembly as the convening committee. The Model United Nation addressed the urgent and sensitive issue of the Israel-Hamas conflict. Thirty-five students participated in this global forum, representing over 25 countries. Additionally, a team of dedicated journalists acted as representatives of the International Press, reporting for various newspapers. The General Assembly was chaired by our alumni Mr. Soheth K. Robin and Mr. Abhiram J.

The students' awareness of various international issues was put to the test as they balanced the dual responsibilities of representing their own nations and addressing global concerns. Delegates were tasked with formulating a resolution that would satisfy both parties affected by the Israel-Hamas conflict, a challenge that required significant intellectual effort. This prompted intense brainstorming sessions, during which representatives from different countries proposed a range of unique and innovative solutions. The diversity of ideas showed the delegates' creativity and their dedication to finding mutually agreeable solutions. It proved that, despite still being students, they have the potential to lead their nations in the right direction in the future.

During the moderated caucus, tensions rose significantly. By the end of the day, all member nations were able to join hands and formulate a unified solution, making significant strides towards global peace.







The programme was very valuable because it gave us more knowledge about filmmaking which includes story making, shooting, and editing. It was a wonderful event and was loved by all who attended it.


























# Another generous act of giving back to school
