





FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES 2024

Wayanad faced a tragic situation this year. As part of flood relief campaign, we have been supported from our province administration and other provinces of the Society of Jesus and institutions.

Our benefactors

Village Reconstruction Organization of Andhra Jesuit Province supported us with rice, school kit and tarpaulin sheets. St Joseph's University, Bengaluru, came forward with a full truck load of a variety of essential items. Sadhana Institute, Lonavala, Jamshedpur Jesuit province, Loyola College, Chennai (both in cash and in kind), Loyola Jesuit Residence, Chennai, Papal Seminary, Pune, Loyola School Sreekaryam, Trivandrum and many individuals and, institutions from Kerala Jesuit province reached out to us. With their helping hand we could go to the villages with food kit, tarpaulin sheets, and school kit.

Our local strength

For unloading, packing, and distributing the kits we had the support from local tribal settlement, Jesuit prenovices, and our staff. Our staff identified the affected villages and individuals. After sorting the items and packing them, we started the kit distribution on the 30th of August and successfully completed it on the 24th of October. As a result of two months' effort, the kit has been

delivered to 59 villages in three panchayats. 1209 families were given food kit, 949 houses were provided with tarpaulin sheets and 459 children were given school kits.

Future Plan

We have some more money with us. We plan to reach out to some houses which leak heavily during the rainy season, in order to repair them. Our plan is to provide them with light roofing sheets. We hope it will be a relief for them during the rainy season. Also, we too plan to provide two families with new houses. These families are living in a plastic-roofed hut. Given their situation, they will not be able to build one on their own. We follow the panchayat specifications in the construction of the house so that they may continue to get all government support.
