Our chief guest for the closing ceremony was Mr Evugin Emmanuel, lead vocalist of the 43 Miles musical band.












































Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru, and Talentspire. The event was conceived as the prelude to a wider initiative involving several organizations at the national and international level coming together to work with schools at the ground level, imbibing the essence of National Education Policy 2020. Loyola School is preparing to be the hub of concerted activities on these lines in Thiruvananthapuram.

We were honoured to have the virtual presence of ISRO Chairman Dr V. Narayanan and the physical presence of Prof. S.K. Satheesh, Chairman of Divecha Centre for Climate Change, Dr. Kuncheria P. Isaac, former Vice-Chancellor of APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University and former Member Secretary of AICTE, and Dr Mathew John, Managing Director of Talentspire.

The dignitaries were warmly received by the school band and escorted by our NCC cadets to the indoor stadium for the programme. The event began with a prayer song, following which Dr V. Narayanan joined us virtually. His insightful speech brought out the dire consequences of climate change and highlighted how space technology could be harnessed to mitigate its effects. The audience consisting of Principals, teachers, and students from fourteen schools was deeply engaged by his words.

In the afternoon, excitement reached its peak with the commencement of the interschool quiz competition. Eight teams participated in an intellectually stimulating contest. After several challenging rounds, Sarvodaya Vidyalaya ICSE clinched the first prize, while Loyola School CBSE and Sree Narayana Public School were awarded second and third place, respectively.

The event was a great success. The attendees left the venue not only enlightened but also inspired to take meaningful remedial action. It was truly a memorable and impactful day—one that reminded us of our responsibility to care for and conserve our shared planet..







## **Staff Empowerment Programme** The main takeaway for me



I had the opportunity to participate in the Teacher Empowerment Programme organized by the Jesuit Educational Association of Kerala Province at Loyola Extension Services. The programme brought together ninety teacher participants from various Jesuit institutions like St Michael's School (Kannur), Sarvodaya HSS (Eachome, Wayanad), St Joseph's Boys' HSS and Loyola School (Kozhikode), AKJM School (Kanjirappally), and Loyola Schools in Sreekariyam, Mukundara, and Thumba.

The objective of the programme was to empower teachers with leadership skills, pedagogical innovation, and a deeper understanding of Jesuit educational values.

The programme began with a formal inauguration ceremony graced by the presence of JEA Secretaty Fr Roy Alex SJ, Rector and Loyola School Manager Fr Sunny Thomas Kunnappallil SJ, Loyola College

Principal Fr Dr Sabu Thomas SJ, Asst. Prof. Fr Dr Ranjit George SJ, and staff members of various Jesuit institution in Kerala. Fr Sunny Kunnappallil SJ formally inaugurated the programme. This was followed by an ice-breaking session, fostering camaraderie and setting the tone for an engaging learning experience.

After the formal inauguration and icebreaking, the first day featured three informative sessions. The first session, "Jesuit Legacy in Education" by the Rector provided a historical perspective on the Jesuit educational mission and its influence on holistic development. This session reaffirmed the importance of nurturing not only academic excellence but also values, compassion, and social responsibility among students. I felt inspired to integrate Jesuit values more consciously into my teaching practices, ensuring that my classroom becomes a space for holistic growth.

Following this, Fr Dr Salvin Augustine SJ delivered an insightful session on "Jesuit Leadership in Education", highlighting the core values of servant leadership and how teachers can embody them. This session encouraged me to lead by example—being empathetic, ethical, and collaborative. I understood that leadership in education is not about authority but about empowering students and colleagues.

The next session, on "The Adolescent Mind: Understanding and Supporting Teens" by Fr Dr Sunny Mayilkunnel SJ offered valuable insights into adolescent psychology, emphasizing the need for empathy, guidance, and emotional support. This session was particularly meaningful to me as I work closely with teenagers. I gained insights into their emotional and psychological

development and learned strategies for creating a safe and supportive classroom environment. It helped me view behavioural issues with more empathy and understanding.

The second day began with a session on 21st century skills for teachers by Dr Dinesh Babu M . This session focused on the essential skills teachers must possess in today's rapidly evolving educational landscape. Dr Dinesh Babu emphasized critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, communication, digital literacy, adaptability, problemsolving, and emotional intelligence as core competencies for modern educators. He highlighted how teaching is no longer about information delivery but about facilitating student-centred, skill-based learning experiences.

This session was truly eye-opening. I realized that being a teacher in the 21st century demands much more than subject knowledge. It requires continuous learning, adaptability to new technologies, and fostering life skills among students. I felt inspired to incorporate digital tools like online learning platforms and interactive resources to make learning more engaging and relevant. Moreover, I understood the need to develop my own soft skills to build stronger bonds with students. After this session, I am motivated to redesign some of my lessons to include more collaborative projects, problem-solving activities. and digital integration that prepare students for real-life challenges.

Building an Interactive Classroom, the session by Fr Syriac Panjikaran SJ, focused on practical methods to make classrooms student-centred and interactive. This was one of the most practically helpful sessions. I realized that even small changes, like using

questioning techniques, encouraging peer discussion, and integrating technology can make a huge difference in student engagement. I plan to redesign some of my lessons to make them more activitybased and interactive.

The final day began with an interaction with Fr Henry Pattarumadathil SJ, the new Provincial. It was an open, freeflowing interaction about the challenges faced by teachers and strategies for handling them effectively. It was an open environment where we could share experiences and concerns. It reassured me that many teachers face similar challenges, and by supporting one another, we can find solutions. I left the session feeling more connected to the teaching community.

The concluding session, "Teacher as a Social Change Agent", by Dr Abey George focused on the transformative role educators play in shaping society through value-based education. This discussion resonated deeply with me. I believe every lesson we teach carries the potential to shape society. It inspired me to design learning experiences that not only meet academic goals but also promote values like equality, sustainability, and social justice.

The programme concluded with an evaluation and feedback, where we shared our reflections and expressed appreciation for the well-structured and enriching experience. The programme was a truly transformative experience. offering a blend of Jesuit educational philosophy, leadership insights, and practical teaching methodologies. It was inspiring to connect with teachers from different schools and share experiences, challenges, and solutions. Personally, I gained a deeper understanding of the Jesuit approach

to holistic education and practical skills to create an interactive, student-centred classroom. The sessions on adolescent psychology and 21st-century skills were particularly impactful, equipping me to better support students in their academic and personal growth.

The Teacher Empowerment Programme successfully achieved its objective of enriching teachers professionally and personally. I am grateful to the Jesuit Educational Association of Kerala for organizing such a well-curated and meaningful event. The lessons from this programme will positively influence my teaching practice and leadership role in education.
